In this grace we receive from Christ Jesus, we give God our praise and thanksgiving. For the light of Christ is found in the resurrection, we see Christ

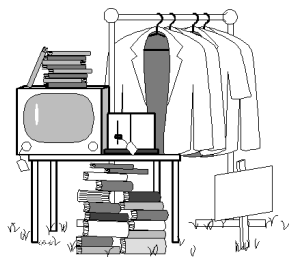

This month we celebrate one of the major Christian holidays—Easter. Music is a huge part of our Easter celebrations for good reason. The whole concept of Easter is very abstract, especially for us who live more than 2,000 years after Easter occurred and who live in a world that puts its ultimate faith in rational, scientific facts. Music helps us come closer to being able to understand such an unusual event as Jesus’s resurrection from the dead.

Easter is a triumphant holiday; it is triumphant because it is the story of the greatest love human beings have ever known. Each year Easter teaches us over and over again about a God who became a man in order to respond with love in the face of hatred. It gives us hope in our salvation. Because of God’s love for each of us, although we will experience physical death, we will not be separated from this love even after we die.

Easter music is triumphant; it helps convey the meaning of Easter at a deeply emotional level. In Easter music we have an example of ways poets and theologians have sought to describe this incomprehensible unending love AND triumphant love.

I hope you are able to think of this triumphant love when on Easter Sunday we, along with Christians all over the world, join in singing “Jesus Christ Is Risen Today”.

Pastor's Ponderings

My name is Pastor Andrea Fluegel. I serve as a Transition Facilitator for the East Central Synod of Wisconsin. Over the next six months or so, I will be partnering with Pilgrim Lutheran's Council and other leadership teams. The purpose of a Transition Facilitator is to provide support, encouragement, and guidance to a congregation as they move forward in the transition process. I also help congregations discern where and to whom God is calling them, which could include shared ministry. Shared ministry means finding ways to share resources, staff, and pastor(s) with another congregation or multiple congregations. I am currently partnering with several congregations in the Greater Wausau area and in the Shawano Conference.

My current agreement is that I partner with Pilgrim for ten hours a month. I will mostly work behind-the-scenes and occasionally you will see me at some congregational meetings. I am excited and blessed to be with you on this journey.

I am married to Erik and we have three children, two of whom are young adults and one is a junior in high school. We currently live in Eagle River, Wisconsin. I have been in ministry since 2000 in a variety of capacities, both lay staff and as an ordained pastor. I am also an ELCA Coach and Spiritual Director. I graduated from Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota, with a focus on congregational and mission development. My passion is walking alongside pastors and congregations. I love asking the questions, "What is God calling us to be and to do for the sake of God's world?" and "Where do we see the Holy Spirit working in this time and place?"

We were enthusiastically excited that our youngest played the trombone in the Northwoods Band in the Rose Bowl Parade in Pasadena, California, on January 2, 2023. (And maybe we were a little jealous that he was in California for the New Year, but maybe not since it rained most of the time.) There were eight school districts involved which included DC Everest, Wausau East, and Mosinee, 400 students and 58 adult chaperones (and six different flights and a semi-truck load of instruments). It is one example of the many ways in which our communities share resources and gifts with each other. It's a beautiful example of what shared ministry looks like. It takes all the gifts and talents of the various music directors, Merrill's marching band trailer, school administrator support, bus drivers, people who specialize in travel logistics, parents, students, and community financial support to make all of this possible. It would be a daunting task for one school.

The Apostle Paul wrote this in his Second Letter to the Corinthians, "So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; look, new things have come into being!" (2 Corinthians 5:17). He goes on to say that through Jesus we are reconciled to God and that we become ambassadors for Jesus. It's a beautiful reminder that through Jesus' divine love and grace, we move forward in life and that we are given this amazing gift of always being created new. That's the gift of Jesus to each of us and to the people of Pilgrim Lutheran. This time of transition is a time when you, the people of God, are being created new so that you can be ambassadors for Jesus, sharing his divine love and grace with neighbors, strangers and those whom you will never meet. It's a beautiful mission that Jesus has called you into. Continue to pray for Vicar Pat, the Council and your lay leaders, as well as the pastor that the Holy Spirit is leading to you, to partner with you in the mission and ministry of Jesus. In addition, pray for who God is calling you to partner with in mission and ministry. Here is a prayer for you to pray each day:

Loving God, be with us, the people of Pilgrim Lutheran and guide us during this time of discernment. Fill our leaders with your wisdom. Keep us mindful of the work you would have us do. Lead us and guide us, O Lord, to be about the work of your kingdom. Bless all who have taken on extra responsibility, and fill them with a sense of your love and presence. Guide all congregations in our East-Central Synod and across the United States who are also in this transition process. Fill us all with the breath of the Holy Spirit. In Jesus' divine love and grace. Amen.

National Alliance on Mental Illness

NAMI Northwoods is an affiliate of NAMI WI, NAMI National, a non-profit organization that provides support, education and advocacy throughout the Marathon, Lincoln, and Langlade counties in Wisconsin on behalf of individuals and families affected by mental illness. NAMI has an office space at Grace United Church at 535 S 3rd Ave., Wausau. The facilitators of NAMI have lived experience with their own illness or have a family member who struggles with mental health issues. All facilitators are approved by the local affiliate and are trained through NAMI Wisconsin.

NAMI education classes are the cornerstone of NAMI's mission. Without knowledge of mental health symptoms, one is completely unaware of what family members can do to help their loved one to receive the right treatment or find resources. The Family to Family, an 8-week class, offers members a well-rounded curriculum of information to educate and support based on individual needs. Besides education, we encourage those to advocate for the best medical treatment available.

Peer Support for those struggling with mental health issues are held the 2nd Monday of the month at Grace United Church at 2:00 p.m. and the 4th Wednesday of the month at Biggby's in Rib Mt at 5:30.

The Family support groups meet once a month at Grace United Church the 4th Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. Resources are available at all support groups.

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: Shirley Ecker called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and Charlene Buttner had devotions.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: (Jenni Zaitz) Minutes were reviewed from the February 14, 2023 Regular Council Meeting. A motion was made by Viegut, second by Freiberg to accept the minutes. Motion carried.

Sign up sheet for bakers and helpers is on the table in the lounge. There was discussion on what to do with the bake sale money. A motion was made by Terra Ecker, second by Freiberg that half of the bake sale money be used for towels, the pastor's discretionary fund and gift cards and gas cards for people in need of assistance and the other half be put into the furnace fund.
