This year Pilgrim is part of a three congregation round robin for Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday. The other two congregations involved are St. Stephen and Good Shepherd. We are going to mix things up a little bit.

Pilgrim is the host for the Ash Wednesday service. For many years we have had a tradition of singing "Jesus, Remember Me" during the imposition of ashes. It is a beautiful song that helps us contemplate our relationship with Jesus. We pray to him that he won't forget us; when he comes into his kingdom, we want our names to be in his heart.

One of the ways we are going to mix things up is to replace "Jesus, Remember Me" while ashes are being imposed and, instead, sing the song "Beautiful Things" printed at the top of this article. What draws me to the words of this song are these: "You make beautiful things out of dust." Each time we have ashes imposed on our heads or on our hands, we hear the words "From dust you came, to dust you will return." This song uses that theme as a theme of hope. Yes, we are made from dust, and it is through our dusty selves that we care for the earth and hope springs from the ground. The last line in the third verse summarizes the message of the song when it says, "Out of chaos, life is being found in you."

This song doesn't plead with Jesus to remember us; it is a song of thanksgiving and praise which says, "You make beautiful things, you make beautiful things out of us." God can take our dusty selves and make beautiful things out of us and through us.

Another way we are mixing it up during the Ash Wednesday service is this song will be accompanied by the ukulele group from Good Shepherd. It's a great example of working together. Our congregation will host the service and we, the hosts, invite a music group from one of the other congregations to provide special music. The Pilgrim/St. Stephen choir along with the Good Shepherd choir will lead the singing for "Beautiful Things" with help from the congregation. The choirs will provide other special music as well for all three services.

It is an exciting time in the life of our congregation. It is an opportunity for us to participate in shared ministry.

The Lord is good... Lamentations 3:25

The season of Lent is quickly approaching. Once again, we will be using the Holden Evening Prayer as our order of worship. Our Lenten worship series for this year will focus on Holy Lament. Understanding that Lent is a season for reflection, this series focuses on the kinds of lament that are found in scripture. So often we have been 'trained' or taught to push our lament aside, to ignore what we are really feeling in our sadness.

This series turns that approach around. Each week, together, we will explore what it means to actually be present with our sadness, to not push it aside. That it is more than okay to wrestle and confront our grief, sorrow, and questions that we may have for God. "How could <u>YOU</u> do this to me?" "Why is this small child allowed to suffer?" The proverbial question of "Why do bad things happen to good people?"

This series reframes lament as one of the most faithful things we can do. In approaching God with honesty and humility, we bring to the open our feelings and thoughts. It may be that they are too big for our hearts and minds to handle without His support. Through this approach we find a God who does not disapprove but will weep with us as we work through the sadness together, not on our own. However, there is hope and joy to be found. In working through the sadness and not around it, we will find that God turns that grief, disappointment, and sadness to hope and joy. Jesus' death on the cross is the ultimate reason why we have hope through the mourning.

LWR PERSONAL CARE KITS—LENTEN COLLECTION

This year, during Lent, we will collect items for personal care kits for Lutheran World Relief. Cleanliness may not actually be next to godliness, but it certainly helps a person feel more human. When families find their homes destroyed, or must flee for their safety, soap and a towel rarely make the cut for what they can carry. Arriving in a refugee camp or other place of safety, they are scared, vulnerable, and dirty from the travel. The simple items included in a Personal Care Kit provide much-needed self-care, critical germ fighting, and the chance to regain dignity amidst situations of fear and uncertainty. Items needed are:

Metal nail clippers (attached file optional) Two or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz. (any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars)



Adult-size toothbrushes in their original packaging (toothbrush multi-packs are acceptable)



Sturdy combs (no picks or fine-toothed combs.)



Lightweight cotton or cotton blend bath-size towel (20" x 40" to 52" x 27"), dark color recommended.
