These are topics that seem especially timely since our four congregations are in conversation with each other about our possible futures.

The theme song for these services called "A Covenant of Grace" sings about each of these questions and it concludes with a message of hope about God's "boundless" love.

Report of the 2024 Synod Assembly

The 2024 Synod Assembly of the East Central Synod of Wisconsin of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America gathered May 17-18th at the Oshkosh Waterfront Convention Center in Oshkosh, Wisconsin. In attendance, 240 voting members registered for the assembly, 63% of whom were lay and 37% were pastors and deacons. There were 15 ministry partner tables and 20 visitors to the assembly.

Gathered under the promise made in baptism, the Assembly theme was, "To Proclaim the Good News of God in Christ through Word and Deed." Several "proclamation moments" were shared throughout the assembly from people of all ages and vocations. The assembly processed to Peace Lutheran Church in Oshkosh for a celebration eucharist. The Rev. Dr. Niveen Ibrahim Sarras was the preacher of the day, sharing words of proclamation based on the Pentecost texts. A dancer and assembly choir enriched worship.

The Rev. Kerri Parker, Executive Director of the Wisconsin Council of Churches shared with us reflections on the intersection of proclamation and public faith. The ELCA churchwide representative to the Assembly was The Rev. Dr. Phil Hirsch, Executive Director, Christian Community and Leadership at Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The service project was designated for Crossways Camping Ministries and the Assembly Offering was designated toward ELCA World Hunger and the Bishop's Resource Fund.

- Approval of <u>2025 Compensation Guidelines</u>
- Adoption of the 2025 Budget
- Election of Synod Council: Adam Clifford and The Rev. Maggie Westaby
- Election of Consultation Committee: Mary Vandenberg and Bob Wiederfoeft
- Election of Committee on Discipline: Natasha Beestman
- Election of 2025 Churchwide Voting Members and Alternates
- The passing of five resolutions:
 - 1. East Central Synod Members "50 Committed to \$50"
 - 2. Resolution to Encourage Participation in "Now is the Time" Study to Further the Work of Racial Equity
 - 3. Action Encouraging the ECSW to Promote Education and Advocacy for Peace in the Holy Land
 - 4. T.E.E.M Candidate Voting Status at the ECSW Synod Assembly
 - 5. Resolution to Support a U.S. Constitution Amendment to Limit Money in Politics

Next year's one day synod assembly will gather at Calvary Lutheran Church in Green Bay on June 7th, 2025 under the theme of the baptismal promise, "To Serve All People Following the Example of Jesus."



REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
May 14th, 2024

GUESTS: Delores Kessel representing the Worship Committee.

MEETING CALLED TO OR-DER: Shirley Ecker called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Devotions were led by Terra Ecker.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: (Jean Trempe) Review of minutes from April 9, 2024 regular council meeting. A motion to accept minutes by Jeanette Carlson and seconded by Terra Ecker. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S **REPORT:** (Charlie Freiberg) Reviewed financial reports for April 2024. Cash on hand once again exceeds the Church's debts. Receipts are on par with prior periods. There was a gain from general operations of \$3,225 for the month. This number excludes restricted expenses and income. Cash in banks totals \$72,647. Of that, \$27,212 are restricted funds with \$17,643 of that restricted for Blessings that Give Hope. The mortgage debt stands at \$65,915. Charlene Buttner made a motion

to accept the Treasurer's report and it was seconded by Terra Ecker. Motion carried.

VICE PRESIDENT'S RE-PORT: (Jeanette Carlson) No Report

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: (Shirley Ecker) Family Day at the Woodchucks will be Sunday July 7. Churches in the area have been invited to attend. Cost will be \$15.50 per person. Drew Berkland, grandson of former long-time members Patti and Merv Berkland is the catcher for the team. A sign up sheet will be made available to determine interest.

The annual rental agreement for Christian Fellowship Church was reviewed. No changes were made to the prior agreement. A motion was made by Charlene Buttner and seconded by Terra Ecker to approve the agreement. Shirley will ask Eugene Viegut to present the agreement to CFC's leadership for signature.

Task Force Update: Progress is slow, but we are moving. Our task force met with St. Stephen's task force on April 29 as a meet and greet session. The results of the meeting were communicated via a press release shared with the congregation via email as well as in a recorded townhall meeting held at Pilgrim. Contact Fred if you would like the link to view the townhall meeting. We agreed to continue to look for areas for the churches to work together, realizing that it will be some time before any major decisions are made. We have shared Pilgrim's Ministry Site Profile document and the last three annual reports with St. Stephen's task force. It was brought up that Pastor Karoline at St Stephen is open to the of merger/collaboration. idea

However, she is relucent to preach at more than one church and prefers to stay with St. Stephen. This may be a consideration as we map a path forward.

Pilgrim's task force is slated to have a similar meeting with Good Shepard's task force on May 29. It is not clear if Immanuel will join in the process as this point. At some point it will be appropriate to have all parties meet together. This will require clear objectives and agenda items. The format for such a meeting is being determined.

A board has been set up at Pilgrim for members to provide feedback on what we think is unique to Pilgrim. There is also a box for suggestions, questions and concerns that can be submitted. Feel free to contact members of the task force as well. The next Townhall meeting is June 8.

President's Meeting Update: President's meeting was held on Tuesday April 30 at St. Stephen. Next meeting is May 28 at St. John's and next month on June 25 at Immanuel.

There will be a community dinner held on Oct. 27 at First Presbyterian Church.

A gift and holiday show is planned for Nov. 2. A bake sale and silent auction may be planned during this event. A possible lunch was discussed. More information will be provided as plans evolve. Information about how to participate as a vendor or volunteer will follow as the event draws near.

A date of January 26, 2025 was established for the annual meeting.

Shirley indicated that she would like to revive the Seeds for Growth program which helped to develop some strategic direction for Pilgrim and offered an opportunity to work with other ELCA churches in the area. The Blessings that Give Hope evolved from this program.

Trunk or Treat was mentioned. This event was for the children in the community and was well attended in the past. A number of members are interested in supporting and volunteering for this event. If there is interest, it will be revived this fall.

All services will be held at 9:00 a.m. Pilgrims are encouraged to attend the services held at our sister churches. The Thursday evening service will be held these weeks.

A special service is planned for June 2 to honor Pilgrim's three high school graduates in the congregation who choose to participate. The plan may change depending on the response to the invitations. Hymns have been picked through August. The next worship committee meeting is Monday June 3 at 2:45 p.m.

LIFE AND GROWTH: (Janet Williams) The April Election Day bake sale was held on Tuesday, April 2. A total of \$955 was raised. The proceeds were evenly divided among the Women's Community, Salvation Army and Neighbor's Place. Thank you to Marathon County for allowing us to continue to hold bake sales during elections. It allows us to continue to serve those in need in our community (and the buying voters are very happy!) A reminder that a condition of holding these sales at a County facility is that we support other nonchurch affiliated charities in the community with the proceeds. The next election is the primary on August 13. Prior to that election we ask for congregational input on which non-profit organizations should be supported with the proceeds.

The Scrip card program is ongoing. Cards are ordered about every two weeks. Orders can be placed with Fred at the church office or Janet Williams (715) 573-3310. It has been taking about five days to receive the cards once the order has been

placed. Current cash balance from Scrip proceeds is \$7,138.
