## **Pastor's Notes**

Greetings Good People of Pilgrim!

Summer is upon us! As we get into the warmer months, many of us have exciting plans to enjoy them. Graduations, vacations, weddings, camping trips, or one of the countless other ways to enjoy our brief summer. While we're all out and about, we will also surely cross paths with many different people. That, in combination with a recent sermon in which we talked about eternal life in the now, got me thinking about the question brought up in the Good Samaritan story: "Who is my neighbor?"

In Luke 10, Jesus tells an expert in the Law that eternal life requires "loving our neighbors." The story Jesus told is about putting words into action. While the lawyer wondered about attaining the reward and achieving the goal, Jesus talked about eternal life now. In essence, Jesus told the lawyer eternal life is in the doing, now, and not sometime in the future.

The Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. talked about the Samaritan in his final sermon, "I've Been to the Mountain Top," the day before he was assassinated. He urged his listeners to employ a "dangerous unselfishness." Speaking about the Jericho Road on which that story takes place, Dr. King said: "It's windy and meandering, conducive to ambushing – that's a dangerous road. So, the first question that the priest

asked, the first question that the Levite asked was, 'If I stop to help this man, what will happen to me?'"

But then, King continued, "The Samaritan came by and reversed the question: 'If I do not stop to help this man, what will happen to him?' That's the question for us tonight," Dr. King said to those gathered: "If I do not stop to help this man, what will happen to him?" That was the question back then and our question today: If we do not stop to help our neighbor, what will happen to them?" Later in Luke 12, Jesus reminds us: "From everyone to whom much has been given, much will be required, and from the one to whom much has been entrusted, even more will be demanded."

So, as we enjoy our summer picnics, celebrations, retreats and travels, it is my hope that we are mindful of those around us and those who might not have the option of fun summer plans. I pray that as we enjoy abundance, we share it with everyone we can. As we enjoy the warmth of the sun, we simultaneously share the warm embrace of God's love with all our neighbors.

May this be a summer filled with love and light, peace and joy, sun and Spirit, for us all.

## Shared Ministry Update from Council President, Shirley Ecker

On Saturday April 29 Sue Ecker, Koerten, Terra Jim Lenselink, and myself met at Mount Calvary Lutheran Church in Rothschild along with church council representatives from Mount Calvary, Immanuel, Good Shepherd, St. John's-Mosinee, and Bethlehem for "A Day of Visioning and Dreaming" with Synod staff Pastor Dara Clifford, Pastor Asher O'Callaghan, and Pastor Andrea Fluegel.

This was a very informative and helpful meeting. We watched a video of two churches in Texas that were facing the same situation we are facing-pastors retiring or taking a new call coupled with not many pastors coming out of seminary to fill those spots. It took these churches a while to do shared ministry. After talking together, they agreed this was the right thing to do. They grew together in mission work, discipleship, lay leadership, and built new friendships with members of the other congregation.

The other church council presi-

dents and I are in contact, discussing shared ministry and what we want or need to do. The more we talk the more evident that this is something we must seriously consider doing. The music and worship people from the congregations are meeting together and planning a combined service on Sunday, July 16. More information to come.

At the end of the meeting on April 29 we were assigned homework. The four people from each congregation needed to meet back together in a few days and decide "What to share" and "When to share it." Sue Koerten, Terra Ecker, Jim Lenselink, and I have developed a list of "What to share." Some of the items we put on our list are: Shared ministry must happen due to the lack of pastors; the pastors in the greater Wausau area are interested in shared ministry; this process will take time; and communication and assistance from congregation members is necessary. There are many more items on this list to share.

"When to share" the information. Pastor Andrea Fluegel will be providing us with Pulpit supply on Sunday June 25 (Vicar Pat and Sarah will be celebrating their wedding anniversary), and we will have a town hall meeting after the service to update you with any more information and listen to any questions you have. Please discern "Is Pilgrim ready to move ahead with shared ministry?" The church council is for a shared ministry, but we need the congregation's support and help in making this a positive experience for all.

- The COVID closures that were still happening earlier this year brought our attendance numbers down a bit. However, we are once again able to restart our programing in most places.
- Chaplain Ray provided the Invocation and Closing Prayer for the swearing-in ceremony for

Sheriff Chad Billeb on January 2nd.

- In the first quarter of the year, we distributed 67 Life Recovery Bibles and 75 Christian inspirational books to the jail for the inmates to request.
- Because of a generous donation, we were able to order 300 much-needed large print hymnals for our elder care facilities.

**Mark your calendars, Pilgrims!!** You may have heard talk about shared ministries within the ELCA congregations in the Wausau area. Pilgrim is actively involved in what shared ministries could look like for us. There is a small group of people working on shared activities we can do to help us get to know our neighbors from our sister congregations. The activity that was chosen for us to do this summer is to have a shared worship service on July 16 at 10:30 a.m. at the Rothschild Pavilion. Currently there are eight congregations who are sponsors for this service. We hope MANY Pilgrims will make the pilgrimage to the Pavilion for this special event.

Among other pieces of this special service, there will be a combined choir from the participating congregations directed by Jim Lenselink. He chose two anthems that have themes of unity in them; he wants us to be deliberate in thinking of ways we can share the ministries God calls us to do with our sister congregations.

You will see some of the words from the anthem "In This Very Room" at the top of this article. It is a song of hope and comfort when it states "in this very room" there is the support we need to show love, joy, hope, and power to all the world because Jesus is with us. Of course, that doesn't mean we will never face grief and pain in our lives and when losses occur, it is normal and healing for us to grieve. It <u>does</u> mean even at times when we may not know how to face challenges, we aren't alone. Jesus is with us, and we are stronger than we realize.

Pastor's Ponderings

What a beautiful celebration you had on the first weekend of May thanking God for God's faithfulness over the last seventy-five years. During those

seventy-five years relationships have been built, strengthened, and grew. They also changed. The community of the people of God is dynamic and ever-changing. Throughout the generations, there is an ebb and flow to congregational life. This moment is no different as together you discover and explore shared pastoral and collaborative ministry.

One of the foundations of shared ministry and collaborative ministry is relationships. Without a sense of trust, loving-kindness and mutual encouragement, we become divided as the gathered people of God. In order to build those relationships, the Council presidents of Pilgrim, Mt. Calvary (Rothschild), St. John's (Mosinee), and Immanuel have been meeting over the last few months for support and encouragement. On April 29, the six congregations of Pilgrim, Mt. Calvary (Rothschild), St. John's (Mosinee), Immanuel, Good Shepherd, and Bethlehem (Kronenwetter) had a day-long working retreat led by Pastor Dara Clifford (Associate to the Bishop, Director for Evangelical Mission) and Pastor Asher O'Callaghan (Associate to the Bishop, Director for Transitions) and Pastor Andrea Fluegel, Transition Facilitator. It was an amazing experience of getting to know other congregations, hearing their stories, and discovering strengths in mutual support and encouragement.

In addition, the Worship and Music leaders of the above congregations have begun to meet for mutual encouragement and learning. They started discussions on collaborative worship and fellowship opportunities. Look for more information on an upcoming Greater Wausau Area worship service on Sunday, July 16 at the Rothschild Pavilion. There will be a picnic and children's activities as well. If you are interested in helping to plan or volunteer for this collaborative worship, please contact Shirley Ecker or myself to get connected. There will also be opportunities to participate in a collaborative choir and a praise and worship band.

This is only the beginning of exploration in collaborative ministry as we work together in mutual encouragement for shared pastoral ministry. Several congregations are starting to explore collaborative ministry opportunities in the areas of children and youth ministry (including VBS, Confirmation and ELCA Youth Gathering) and community engagement and service. If you are interested and have a passion in these areas, please contact Shirley Ecker or myself to get connected.

On May 25, Pastor Dara Clifford went through the Congregational Vitality survey that you as a congregation completed in March/April. Pilgrim's top five strengths are: leadership culture, gospel preaching, accessibility (regarding building's accessibility to those needing more physical assistance), worship services, and community connections.

Exciting ministry is happening. The Holy Spirit is at work in the Greater Wausau area. Your energy, support, and participation is needed to keep the momentum going. MEETING CALLED TO OR-DER: Shirley Ecker called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and she had devotions.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: (Jenni Zaitz) Minutes were reviewed from the April 11, 2023 Regular Council Meeting. A motion was made by Koerten, second by Freiberg to accept the minutes. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: (Charles Freiberg): Reviewed the current finances. April was a very good month which included 5 Sundays and Easter. We had a gain of \$4,500 for the month but year to date are behind by \$500. A motion was made by Buttner, second by Viegut to accept the Treasurers Reports. Motion carried.

VICE PRESIDENTS REPORT: (Jeanette Carlson) No report

VICARS REPORT: (Vicar Patrick Kempf) Things are going well and are back to normal after Easter. He is continuing with the call process. On April 29, 2023 "A Day of Visioning and Dreaming" was held at Mount Calvary Lutheran Church. There were 6 churches in attendance: Mount Calvary Lutheran, Pilgrim Lutheran, Immanuel Lutheran, Good Shepherd Lutheran, St. John's Lutheran in Mosinee and Bethlehem Lutheran. Each church send 4 members. The following Synod staff were also in attendance: Pastor Dara Clifford, Pastor Andrea Fluegel and Pastor Asher O'Callaghan. The Pilgrim representatives were: Sue Koerten, Terra Ecker, Jim Lenselink and Shirley Ecker. This meeting focused on "What to share and when to share it". Pilgrim's top 5 strengths were determined from our vitality survey as being: Leadership culture, Gospel preaching, Accessibility, Worship services and Community connections. A link will be emailed to Pilgrim's congregation to join in a webinar for vitality survey results with Pastor Dara on Thursday, May 25<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m. Sunday, June 25<sup>th</sup> after worship the first town hall meeting will be held to update the congregation on what we are working on. Pastor Andrea Fluegel will be our supply pastor on Sunday, June 25<sup>th</sup>. The date for the annual congregational meeting will be January 28, 2024. Pastor Andrea has requested that her monthly payment be designated as a housing allowance. A motion was made by Koerten, Second by Terra Ecker to designate Pastor Andrea Fluegel's \$500 monthly payment as a housing allowance for the length of her agreement. Motion carried.

WORSHIP REPORT: (Sue Koerten) We are exploring shared ministry. Pilgrim's music/worship team consisting of Delores Kessel, Shirley Ecker and Sue Koerten have attended several meetings with members from St. John's in Mosinee, Mt. Calvary, Immanuel Lutheran and Good Shepherd . The purpose of the meetings is to start to build relationships with our peers from other congregations. We are planning a shared worship service with these five congregations by September. More information will follow. A motion was made by Buttner, second by Lenselink for Pilgrim to be one of the sponsoring churches for the shared ministry combined worship service on July 16, 2023. Motion Carried.


