With your support we raised more than \$13 million for initial and ongoing efforts in and around Ukraine since the Russian invasion began more than two years ago. Amid one of the worst refugee crises in recent history, Lutheran Disaster Response's partners in the region gathered food, clothing, and other supplies and opened their doors wide to the traumatized people who began to arrive.

The impact of the war is felt around the world. In 2023, Europe alone experienced fuel shortages, existing food shortages were exacerbated, and Russia prevented the shipment of wheat from Ukraine to other countries, worsening the world food crisis.

In 2024 Lutheran Disaster Response and its partners continue to respond, thanks to your generosity. One program aims to restore or establish small farms, which provides critical agricultural livelihoods, strengthens local communities and improves food security and household income for war-torn vulnerable populations. Resources include chicks, chicken coops, feeders, vegetable seeds, gardening tools, canning kits, pickling containers, and training. Grants have also helped. Over 7,000 individuals and families benefitting directly from grant work in 2023, and that number continues to grow in 2024.

MINUTES REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING June 11th, 2024

PRESENT IN PERSON: Shirley Ecker (President), Jeanette Carlson (Vice President), Jean Trempe (Secretary), Linda Konkel (Evangelism Chair), Charlene Buttner (Church and Society Chair), Jim Lenselink (Stewardship Chair), Kay Palmer (Buildings & Grounds Chair), Sue Koerten (Worship Chair)

EXCUSED: Charlie Freiberg (Treasurer), Janet Williams (Life and Growth Chair), Terra Ecker (Children and Youth Chair)

MEETING CALLED TO OR-DER: Shirley Ecker called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Devotions were led by Kay Palmer. It related to how God invites us to seek relationships, bound together by Christ.

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

(Jean Trempe) Review of minutes from May 14,2024 regular council meeting. A motion to accept minutes by Jeanette Carlson and seconded by Charlene Buttner. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

(Jean Trempe in Charlie Freiberg's absence) Reviewed financial reports for May 2024. Cash on hand once again exceeds the Church's debts. Cash in banks totaled \$72,064, with \$27,666 held as restricted funds. The largest portion of restricted funds is for Blessings that Give Hope of \$18,271. Our long-term loan stands at \$65,206. Receipts and expenses are on par with prior periods. Sue Korten made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report and it was seconded by Jeanette Carlson. Motion carried.

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT: (Jeanette Carlson) No Report

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: (Shirley Ecker)

- CFC Lease Mr. Yeng, the Treasurer of Christian Fellowship Church has requested changes to the lease agreement for Fellowship Hall. Rather than an annual arrangement, CFC requests that the lease be changed to month to month. CFC has paid rent through November. They are in discussion about possibly ending our relationship due to their declining membership. The council changed the lease language to make it a month to month lease. The notice provision was changed to 60° days versus a 20 day written notice. Jim Lenselink made a motion to modify the lease as discussed and Charlene Buttner seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- Task Force Press Release: The task forces of Pilgrim and Good Shepherd met on May 29 at Good Shepard. We introduced ourselves and toured the facility. Congregational histories were shared. Good Shepard presented a timeline of their activities from April 2023 to present. Pilgrim outlines our history of being a teaching congregation over the past 7-8 years. Good Shepard shared information about some of their ministries including formation of a large home visitation team. Time was spent discussing exciting ideas about how our congregations can work together and reach out to the community. The meeting concluded with a discussion on the format of future meetings.
- Other Task Force Info: We are coming along! There have been a couple of activities with Good Shepherd and St. Stephen. There are some elements of folks working to figure out next steps. Our Town Hall Meeting covered fears and hopes. The conversation was

insightful. The comments will be considered as we move forward in the next steps of a potential transition.

- President's Meeting Update: The May Presidents meeting was canceled. The next meeting is scheduled for June 25 at Immanuel.
- A meeting will be set up with Good Shepard to discuss how their home visitation team might help Pilgrim develop our team or possibly using members of their team to reach more of our congregation.
- The Blessings that Give Hope Program will be dormant over the summer. A meeting of the volunteers will be set up to discuss plans for the fall.
- Seeds for Growth members will meet on Thursday June 13 to discuss possible projects we could pursue with the congregations not currently part of our transition conversations.
- A community Baby Shower is planned for August 11 at St. Stephen. An event is being planned to provide donations for Marty's Bus on July 28 supporting the unhoused. A joint project is being planned for September 8 which is "God's Work, Our Hands" Sunday. It will be held at White Water Park. More information to follow. We are discussing Trunk or Treat for October 26. Volunteers will be needed as well as some decorated trunks!
- Application for Interns/ Students – The council discussed applying for an intern or a student. Though a student may not be available, all felt it was worth applying at Luther in Minneapolis and Wartburg. Shirley will make some contacts with the seminaries and email Pastor Asher of the Synod about possibilities for Su-

pervising Pastor candidates.

MEETING CALLED TO OR-

DER: Shirley Ecker called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Devotions were led by Linda Konkel. Linda shared the story of Martha. How are we using our time and talents and giving of ourselves in meaningful ways. Are we serving with joy?

SECRETARY'S REPORT: (Jean

Trempe) Review of minutes from June 11,2024 regular council meeting. A motion to accept minutes by Jim Lenselink and seconded by Terra Ecker. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

(Charlie Freiberg, reported by Jean Trempe) Reviewed financial reports for June 2024. Cash on hand once again exceeds the Church's debts. Cash in banks totaled \$73,143, with \$24,813 held as restricted funds. The largest portion of restricted funds is for Blessings that Give Hope of \$15,417. Our long-term loan stands at \$64,589. Receipts include \$956 generated from the recycle and bake sale. Contributions are on par with prior periods. It should be noted that there were five Sundays in June. Expenses came in as expected, however a bill for comprehensive insurance missed the cut off and will be paid in July. Sue Korten made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report and it was seconded by Charlene Buttner. Motion carried.

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT: (Jeanette Carlson) No Report

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: (Shirley Ecker)

- President's Meeting Update: The June 25th Presidents meeting focused on ways to improve communication among the ELCA churches in the area. Suggestions were made such as sharing newsletters. The Wisconsin River Valley Conference has set up a website site where churches can submit information to be posted. The next meeting is scheduled for July 23.
- A meeting has been set up with Good Shepard to discuss how they created a home visitation team. Our focus will be to get more Pilgrims involved and trained. Anyone interested in learning more should come to a meeting at Pilgrim on July 18 at 6:00 p.m.
- The Blessings that Give Hope Program will be dormant over the summer. A meeting of the volunteers will be set up to discuss plans for the fall.
- Shirley has reached out to Wartburg and Luther Seminar-

ies concerning availability of interns/students. She will also be discussing possible supervising pastor candidates with Synod staff. Applications for Wartburg are due December 1 and are due January 31 for Luther.

Donations for Marty's Bus will be accepted on July 28 at the Pilgrim shared service. All donations support the unhoused. On July 21's shared service at Good Shepard, donations will be accepted for The Women's Community. The August 11 service at St. Stephen will collect baby items. Donations for the August 4 service at Immanuel have not vet been determined. More specific information about the items to be collect with follow in coming weeks.

TRANSITION TASK FORCE UPDATE: The next meeting of the Pilgrim Transition Task Force is set for July 16. There will be a brief Town Hall meeting on Sunday July 14, following the service. A reminder that there is a question box on the sign-up sheet table in the lounge if you have questions or concerns that you would like to have addressed. You may also reach out to any task force member. There are individual meetings scheduled for the Transition Task Force chairs and council presidents of all churches in the Wausau Area to meet with Pastor Dara of the Synod on July 20. Shirley, Kay and Jeff will attend. Each church's representatives will have separate meetings with Pastor Dara. A separate meeting is planned for July 22 for the Transition Task Force chairs and communications people to discuss next steps for our four churches, Pilgrim, St. Stephen, Good Shepard and Immanuel. Progress on this project is moving slowly with little activity over the past couple of

months. At present the steps for-

ward are unclear. More information will follow after the July 22 meeting.

A press release was received from a June 25th meeting of Good Shepard and St. Stephen task forces. They discussed the summer shared services. Pastor Caroline will follow up on a tentative shared meeting to be held at Waypost Camp on Mission Lake for task forces and church councils. Good Shepherd and St. Stephen are individually pursuing coaching opportunities available through the Synod. There was no update from Immanuel at this time. Good Shepherd is hoping for another "get acquainted" session with Pilgrim. Plans for the fall were discussed. Examples given were property, finance, visitations and social ministry. It was also mentioned that contact names are being shared between the quilters of the three churches. A tentative meeting of quilters was set for July 23 at 5:30 at St. Stephen. (Pilgrim quilters need more information.)

WORSHIP REPORT: (Sue Koerten) Plans are moving along nicely for the upcoming shared worship services with Good Shepherd, St Stephen and Immanuel. These services give our members a time to share with members of other congregations, build relationships for working together and also will be a time to share common goals. We hope man Pilgrims will take the opportunity to attend these shared services in an effort to get to know our fellow ELCA members.

- There are opportunities for members who would like a ride to sign up on the Carpool signup in the lounge.
- We are in need of refreshments for the coffee hour after the service at Pilgrim on July 28. There is a signup sheet in the lounge.
- We will pass offering plates during the services at each

church. Pilgrim members offering envelopes will be channeled back to Pilgrim at the services at the other churches. There will also be a noisy money offering for Crossways Camping Ministries. Any loose bills in the plate will go to the host church.

• Reminders regarding where the services are each week will be sent out. There will not be a Sunday service at Pilgrim on the weeks assigned to the other churches. (July 21, August 4 and August 11.)

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS: (Kay Palmer, reported by Jean

Trempe) A leak occurred in the corner of the library area during heavy rain. Repairs were completed on July 9. A dead tree was taken down behind fellowship hall today. Clean up of the debris is underway. The old riding lawn mower was fixed and is running thanks to one of the gardeners. The council discussed what to do with the old mower. It was suggested that we sell it on an "as is" basis. Another suggestion was to offer it for a free will offering. No decision was made. It was suggested that the committee make the decision. Thanks to the folks who are mowing the grass and doing the outdoor maintenance -Randy Ecker, John Trempe, Bob Windorski and Kevin Zaitz. The new mower is working well. Anyone needing to learn how to operate the new mower can either review the manual in the garage or contact John Trempe.
